 - V. Victoria Shroff is credited as one of the first and longest serving animal law lawyers in Canada. She has been practicing animal law for 20 years in downtown Vancouver at Shroff and Associates and is also Adjunct Professor of animal law at Allard School of Law at UBC. Ms. Shroff also teaches a brand-new course in animal law at the School of Legal Studies at Capilano University. She has been recognized for her pioneering work in animal law, was a finalist nominee for Canadian Lawyers' Top 25 Most Influential Lawyers in Canada in 2018 and 2019 and is frequently interviewed about animal matters in the media. Ms. Shroff has lectured on animal law locally, in USA and in Asia. She also regularly contributes animal law articles for legal, pet and mainstream publications. Victoria Shroff founded and teaches an animal law program called 'Paws of Empathy' which she teaches with a dog or two.
