Update from the Administration

The VSB recently allowed an option for secondary schools to change the Face to Face/Remote rotations from the current 2-week rotation to a 1-week rotation. At Kitsilano, we will be maintaining the current 2-week rotation for Quarter 2. The decision was made after surveying and meeting with all of the staff. The reasons for this decision are as follows:

- Maintaining consistency and stability rather than introducing another change.
- Students and staff have already adjusted to the current rotation schedule, pacing, and rhythm.
- Curriculum & instructional delivery is more effective in a 2-week rotation. Curriculum units generally last 2 weeks and the current rotation allows for more hands-on, project based learning opportunities.
- Introducing more change may increase confusion and stress regarding the schedule, pace, and intensity.
- There is not enough data or evidence available to make an informed decision, nor to support, that the change would be more beneficial.
