#### d. <u>Parent Education Speakers</u> - Alan Patola Moosmann

PAC organized an online presentation "Coping with Unexpected Loss" on Tuesday, April 4, 2023. Two staff and a volunteer from the Crisis Centre presented to 20 parents. Handouts from the workshop were available at this meeting. Resources will also be posted to the PAC website. A parent suggested that this become an annual presentation to plan and budget for.

Note, parent education expenses cannot be assigned to Gaming Funds, they have to be paid from donations and fundraising.

Discussion about whether this topic could be triggering and should only be arranged if there is an incident as there was this year. Presenters said it is fine and good to talk about difficult topics like this. "You can't prevent it if you can't name it."

#### e. Grad Parents - Alan Patola Moosmann

The parent committee is working with a large but tight budget to provide light refreshments, decor and photo stations for the after ceremony reception at the Queen Elizabeth Theatre. Each grad received two tickets for family to attend. Extra tickets costing \$19 each will be released in stages. The venue holds 3000 so we should not run out of space! A light snack will be provided for the grads since they have to arrive at 5:00 pm to be ready for the 6:00 ceremony.

Opportunities for donations to help pay for the pre-ceremony snacks are being considered.

- Q Would they consider charging more for tickets to help with expenses?
- A No, if tickets are \$20 or more there is an additional processing fee.
- Q What does the \$150 Grad Fee include? (Note: Grad 2023 was able to access \$50/student via the one-time Student & Family Affordability Fund.)
- A Venue (Queen Elizabeth Theatre), cap & gown, two tickets, decorations, flowers.
- Q Why are single-use caps & gowns being bought? Wouldn't it be better to reuse?
- A This has been researched extensively in the past. It is just as expensive to rent and there are tight timelines to return everything undamaged. There is no storage at the school to have our own set.

The Choral Program launched September 2022 has been wildly popular with 15 schools and 1100 students taking part. After getting off to such a successful start, it is more than DPAC has capacity for and it will be passed on to new organizers.

Q to the Principal - How have things been going without a Student Liaison Officer for the last two years?

A - There are no qualitative or quantitative results to comment on. The program ended during the pandemic. When she was at other schools, Ms. Kwon found the relationships were helpful. Many conversations are happening and it will take time to develop a re-imagined program for the 18 very different secondary schools in Vancouver. It might not be ready to launch in September 2023.
