<u>Teacher report – Carol-Anne MacMillan</u>

- 1) Jr. Drama have held auditions and their production will be up and running late October. Senior Production heads off to Ireland in November to film in a castle, a FANTASTIC enhancement to the curriculum that wouldn't be possible without PAC support!
- 2) Our annual Terry Fox Run was another success with the whole school participating by either walking or running on a lovely September morning. We're hoping this year tops our fundraising from LAST year, which was #2 in the district!
- 3) Collapsing of 6 blocks due to this year's funding shortfall to VSB District due to lower-than-predicted enrolment for the district. This mostly impacted Grade 8 classes, requiring re-scheduling of their classes. The 8s have the most flexible schedules compared to other grade levels, and in my experience "losing" 3 English 8 students and gaining 6 new students hasn't caused any major upset. We rolled with it just fine.
- 4) The discussion about collapsing blocks has me putting on my union hat for a minute. I encourage PAC members to check out the publicly available online facts about VSB District unconscionable (in my opinion) 2024 pay raises to the already highest paid employees at the board. For example, the Superintendent received a \$49,000 pay raise, and the Deputy Superintendent received a \$66,000 raise! This, in a time when the average funding per Grade 8 student for Art is less than a dollar! I encourage PAC members to attend a school board meeting to ask the Superintendent, et al, why they think they have earned such largesse from taxpayers?

8) School Parking Lot and Street Safety

- school parking lot is for VSB Staff only; parents/guardians are asked to not drive through or use the school parking lot
- adhere to the street and traffic regulations around the school perimeter
- directly in front of the school, there is a no stopping zone on Trafalgar St. and 11th Avenue
- use calmer streets such as 10th Avenue or Larch Street to drop-off/pick-up your child
- consider drop off/pick up at off peak times earlier before start of school and later after the end of the school day

9) Personal Digital Device Policy

In January 2024, the Province of B.C. mandated all school boards to update their Codes of Conduct to limit students' use of personal digital devices during school hours. Below in blue is the policy in our school code of conduct. Last school year, we implemented the new PDD policy. This year, we will continue implementation of the PDD policy with the goal of consistent application and compliance of the PDD policy by all students and staff. It is expected that every member of the community will know what the PDD policy looks like in our community and be able to follow it and demonstrate that in their decision making and behaviour.

Personal Digital Device Usage To foster a safe and focused learning environment for students, the use of personal digital devices, that distract from learning, such as cell phones, tablets and electronic devices, are restricted during school hours and on school property. Educators and school staff will continue to model digital citizenship in the classroom and avoid the use of personal digital devices for non-instructional purposes.

Personal digital devices must be turned off or placed on silent mode before entering the classroom and remain silent during the school day. Personal digital devices are not permitted for use during class time unless an educator has given permission.

The use of personal devices is permitted under the following circumstances:

- For educational purposes, as directed by the educator in the classroom.
- For health and medical purposes as outlined in an Individual Education Plan or Student Safety Plan.
- To support special or diverse educational needs, such as assistive technology related to Individual Education Plans or Student Support Plans.

The expectation is that students will follow the personal digital device policy and school guidelines.

The Vancouver School Board is not responsible for the loss, damage, or disappearance of personal digital devices that students decide to bring to school.

How can parents/caregivers help?

- talk to your child about strategies to manage use of personal devices in general
- talk to your child about the PDD policy; expectations of use in school
- do not call/text your child during class time; if you need to speak to your child, call the school office


